

Veterans Memorial Park Update

January was a good month for the fund-raising effort. The big hit was a donation of \$125,000 from the Bryant Foundation to be used to purchase the centerpiece. This donation, plus the earlier pledge of \$50,000 by the Wahlin Foundation for the archway, was tremendous boosts. Sales, donations, and pledges now total over \$481,000 toward our goal of \$800,000.

Excavating Begins at Veterans Memorial Park

Visible progress at the Stoughton Area Veterans Memorial Park began in earnest last week with the excavation of dirt in advance of setting the footings. The R.G. Huston Construction Company of Cottage Grove did the work.

The first step was the removal of all black dirt and clay to a depth of seven feet. That space was then backfilled and compacted with layers of sand. Dave Stolen, cochairman and senior staff consultant of the construction phase of the project, remarked, "We were very fortunate in that the digging crew discovered a mother lode of sand, which was used for the backfill. Otherwise sand would have had to be trucked in".

Huston also leveled the parking lot area. In the next week, Jon Halverson of the Forever Sandfill and Limestone Company will make an in-kind donation and haul in the gravel needed for the parking lot. When the frost is out of the ground, the engineer will set new grades for the concrete work. The concrete company will then pour the footings. After the footings have set for a month, the concrete flat work will commence.

All good black soil will then be leveled over the area.

Bryant Foundation Donates \$125,000

Another big story is the significant donation of \$125, 000 by the Bryant Foundation. This money will be used to purchase the centerpiece for the park. This six-foothigh granite monument, with a bronze eagle on top, will contain the names of 150 Stoughton area servicemen killed in action dating back to the Civil War. The eagle has a wing span of six feet.

The Bryant Foundation donation, along with an earlier donation of \$50,000 from the Wahlin Foundation, gives a tremendous boost toward reaching the goal of \$800,000.
