Wahlin Foundation Pledges \$50,000 to Veterans Memorial Park

The Stoughton Area Veterans Memorial Park Fund received a tremendous boost recently with a \$50,000 pledge from the Wahlin Foundation. The money will be used to fund the archway entrance to the park.

The broad program of the Wahlin Foundation is to support the charitable needs in the general areas where the manufacturing plants of Stoughton Trailers LLC are located. According to Betsy McClimon, Executive Director of the Foundation, "Our goal is to enrich the lives and promote opportunities in the communities where our employees work and live."

Stoughton Trailers, which was founded by military veteran, Don Wahlin, and his wife, Carol, started the Stoughton-based business in 1961. Since 1999, the Foundation has awarded nearly three million dollars to address the charitable needs in the communities of Stoughton, Brodhead, and Evansville.

McClimon said "donating to the Stoughton Area Veterans Memorial Park is a real opportunity to support and honor the veterans of the Stoughton community."

Paver Gift Certificates for Sale

Gift certificates for pavers for the Stoughton Area Veterans Memorial Park will go on sale Thanksgiving week.

According to Randy Robertson, co-chairman of the fund-raising committee, people will be able to purchase either an 8x8 or an 8x16 paver to give to a grandfather, father, uncle, mother, etc. or in honor of a deceased loved one. The purchaser will pay for the paver and receive a card, to give as a gift, with a paver form on the back. The recipient can then fill out the card and send the order in.

The cost of an 8x8 paver is \$150 and an 8x16 paver is \$250. The gift cards will be available at the bars of the VFW and American Legion.
