Erickson. Greg was awarded the Purple Heart as a result of injuries sustained in combat in Vietnam in 1967.

Purple Heart Recipient Sergeant Greg Vodak

Gregory L. Vodak entered the Marine Reserves on February 1, 1966. While taking boot camp in San Diego, he decided to switch to the regular Marine Corps for a commitment of four years. His reasons for enlisting were to serve his county and to take advantage of the educational benefits offered to veterans. Greg was deployed to Vietnam on December 10, 1966 as a combat engineer. In addition to building roads and bridges for the infantry, his job consisted of sweeping roads and bridges nearly every day to clear them of mines and booby traps. He was stationed near Calu, which is north of Da Nang near the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ). On the morning of April 25, 1967 while riding on a truck with other engineers to build a bridge near Khe Sanh, a mountaintop Marine base, his convoy was ambushed by the North Vietnamese firing automatic weapons and rockets. When his truck was disabled by a land mine, Lance Corporal Vodak jumped to the ground and, while lying on his belly, kept firing at the attackers. At that time, Greg was hit in the right knee by enemy rifle fire. He kept firing at the attackers until the remainder of his platoon had pulled back and things quieted down. He then crawled on his hands and knees about 100 yards to rejoin the remainder of his platoon. All but two had been killed or wounded.

Greg was given morphine and evacuated to a field hospital, examined, and then sent to a hospital near Da Nang; then to a hospital in Yokohama, Japan; and finally to a hospital ship, the USS *Sanctuary* for surgery. It was there that he found out he had three

broken bones in his knee. After surgery, Greg was transferred to hospitals in Philadelphia, Subic Bay, Philippines, Alaska, and Andrews Air Force Base in Maryland before being sent to Great Lakes, IL for rehabilitation. He spent six months in a cast followed by six more months in rehabilitation.






