Post 59 Veterans Service Officer Report

During February Commanders Mike Currie (Post 59), Rob Drogsvold (VFW), Auxiliary President Amy Hermes and myself met and toured Stoughton's Heroes Center followed by discussions on how our service organizations can better support the veterans that are living at the facility. There is a need for adult men and female clothing, personal hygiene products, and nonperishable food products. If you wish to donate any of these or other items that can be used to support their daily living, please contact the Site Director Adrieanna at 608-609-0480 or by email at adrieanna@certidry.com

In our January 2023 Quarterly Newsletter Bud Erickson reminded veterans and their families that it is important to be able to provide proof of veteran's active military service (DD 214) to the funeral home director. This can be done as a prearranged funeral package or at time of death. This will ensure that the veteran is provided with proper military rights at time of their funeral. If you need assistance in locating a DD 214, please contact the Dane County Veterans Service Office at (608)266-4158 or The Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs at (800)-947-8387.

Members and their families are also encouraged to prepare and have on file a Survivor's Plan/Checklist. There are many available online for each service or all services such as the one on the following link.

The PACT Act and your VA benefits

The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances.

The PACT Act adds to the list of health conditions that we assume (or "presume") are caused by exposure to these substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their survivors with the care and benefits they have earned and deserve.

Federal and State VA Services will not be contacting veterans and/or widows of veterans that may have reported and/or died from conditions related to the PACT Act. The Dane County Service Office is overwhelmed with request and will not be able to canvas area Stoughton residents. So, if you know of a veteran and especially a widow of a veteran that may be eligible, please relay this information to them or a member of their family.
