Veterans Corner

William Dennis Redepenning U.S. Air Force 1971 -1975

Bill enlisted in the U.S. Air Force on March 14, 1971 when he was 17 years old, wanting to better himself and to also to receive some better pay. He was inducted in Milwaukee, WI after receiving his physical exam.

He received his Basic training at Lackland Air Force Base in Texas. He was there for about 12 weeks. From there he went to Technical School at Chunute Field in Illinois. He trained as a Crash Rescue Fighter and was then sent to McConnel Air Force Base in Wichita, Kansas. He spent 1.5 years in Kansas.

He was then stationed in the Philippines where he continued is Rescue Firefighter assignments at Clark Air Force Base. He was a fireman through out his four years in the air Force.

He received the following citations during his military career:

- Good Conduct Medal
- National Defense Service
 Medal

One memorable experience that came to mind during the interview concerned Bill helping to put out a fire of his base Commanders house.



The Commander had poured gasoline into his lawn mower, which was under the carport. The gasoline ignited and ended up burning his house down.

Another memorable experience-Sortly before leaving Kansas, A B-52 crashed at the end of the runway and caught on fire. It was the first aircraft that crashed on this Kansa Base and his Rescue Dept. helped in extinguishing the blaze.

The C-41's, which were basically flying hospitals, would bring many wounded soldiers to Clark Air Force Base for treatment. The Fire Department would be notified of the planes arrival and they would make sure everyone got off the plane safely. After receiving necessary treatment, they would be sent a stateside hospital.

At the end of the Vietnam conflict, Tent cities were set up at Clark to accommodate Vietnamese evacuees who were in need of sleeping quarters. This was the first stop for these evacuees.

During this time Bill was on Red Alert, which means if they were needed in an emergency, they would be the first ones called.

Bill received a call one afternoon when one of the planes leaving Vietnam. The plane was shot down and had casualties on board. Bill was unable to participate, but his best buddy ended up going (Operation Air Lift). The PX was closed so the Vietnamese could be taken care of.

The war was technically over and efforts were made everyone air lifted out of Vietnam ASAP. Bill left the Philippines in 1975. He was flown back to his hometown of Cottage Grove, WI. He was married to Lori in October 1972 while home on leave. She had been his grade school and high school girlfriend. They have two children, ill Jr. who was born in the Philippines and a daughter, Heather.

Bill worked at a gas station for a while, then at Oscar Mayer for 10 years. He was an electric lineman for 13 years in Deerfield, WI. He was then hired by Wisconsin Power and Light Co. and is presently employed there. Bill was the Commander of American Legion Post 59 for
