



Veterans Corner DEBRA DAWN HOTTINGER WI Army National Guard 1985-2006 By Evelyn Kahl



Debra was born on 10/21/33 in Chicago, IL. She grew up in Freeport, IL. After completing High School she moved to Monroe, WI. She graduated from Blackhawk Area Technical College in Janesville where she received an Associate Degree in Accounting.

March 11, 1985 she entered the WI Army National Guard at the age of 28. Her reason for enlisting was because she thought it would look good on a resume. She initially entered as an M-Day soldier (1 weekend a month & 2 wks during the summer). She received her Basic Training at Fort Dix, NJ and received Advanced Individual Training (AIT) at Fort Benjamin Harrison, IN where she learned her job skill as a Unit Clerk from June 3 1985-Sept. 1985. Because of her age the other soldiers who were 17 & 18 yrs. old called her "Grandma".

She was assigned to the 1158th Transportation Co. in Monroe, WI as the Unit Clerk. After approximately 1 yr., she transferred to the Active Guard Reserve program. This meant she would work full time for the military on active duty. During her time in this program she had many different positions. She served as a recruiter in Milw., WI. She was a Unit Clerk for the 106th Maintenance Co. also in Milw., WI. She then transferred to the 232nd Personnel Service Branch as a records clerk in Madison, WI. At this time she moved to Stoughton, WI. She also worked for the 147th Aviation Battalion in the S-1 and deployed to Kuwait for a period of 6 months. After that she transferred to State Headquarters where she was the Student Loan Repayment Manager and the Bonus Manager until her retirement.

When she deployed to Kuwait, VFW representatives came to speak to the soldiers and gave them calling cards, a free membership in the VFW for $1\ yr$. When that yr. expired she then joined VFW Post 328 in Stoughton and has been a Life member for $9\ yrs$.

She retired on Aug. 31, 2006 as an E-7 Sergeant First Class with over 21 yrs. of service to her country. Awards and Metals Received: Meritorious Service Metal, Army Achievement Medals (2), Army Service Ribbon, Driver's Mechanic Badge, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal, NCO Professional Development Ribbon (3), Army Forces Expeditionary Medal, National Defense Service Medal (2), Armed Forces Reserve Medal W/M, Armed Forces Reserve Medal W/2, Global War of Terrorism Medal, Good Conduct Medal (6), WI Service Ribbons (3), WI Wright Medal (20), Army Overseas Training Ribbon, Expert Rifle Badge M/16, Army Lapel Button.

Since her discharge she continues to reside in Stoughton where she spends her time as a puppy raiser for "Leader Dogs for the Blind" and time with her 5 Grandchildren. She owes much gratitude to her two sons, Dennie and A.J. who made many sacrifices while their mother was serving her country for those 21 yrs. She spends her winters in Weeke Wachee, FL where she is a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary. Debra has been in the Legion for 9 years and is a paid up for life member. She is also a member of American Legion Post 59 and a Past Senior Vice for VFW Post 328.
